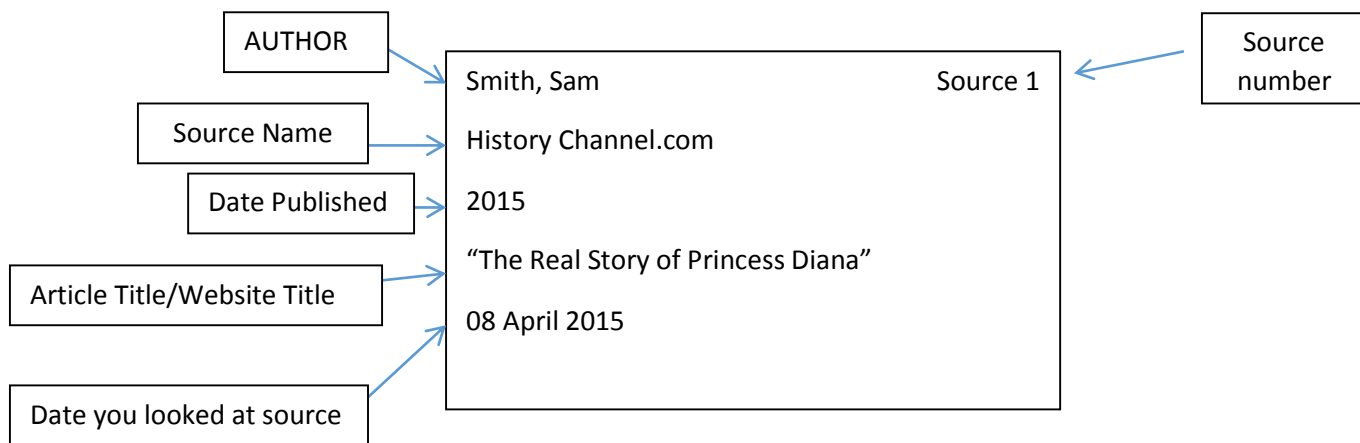


WHAT GOES ON A SOURCE CARD?

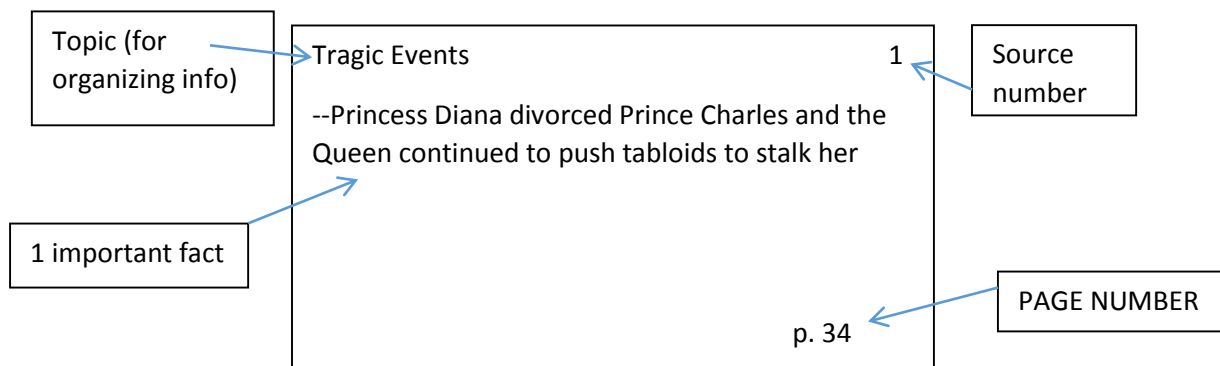
As much as you can find!

- Full citation from a database or citation website like easybib.com
- Author
- Publisher (History Channel, Time Magazine, etc.)
- Date published
- Page numbers
- Title of web page or article name
- Title of book
- ASSIGN IT A SOURCE NUMBER or LETTE



WHAT GOES ON A NOTE CARD?

- Source number (in the top or bottom corner so you know where these facts came from)
- A paraphrased fact or directly quote with " " around it
- PAGE NUMBERS (if applicable)
- Optional
 - Topic like "Early Life" or "Growing Up"
 - ONE important fact that is paraphrased from the original text
